My interest stems from trying to understand why my vehicle, on December 3rd 2011, went out of control in a single car accident while exiting the Red Hill Valley Parkway southbound lanes on the King Street off ramp, injuring me catastrophically.

I am anxious to learn if the road surface was a contributing factor by reason of it having an unsafe coefficient of friction, kept publicly silent perhaps as far back as 2007.

Through my counsel I would like to learn as much as possible about the composition and testing of the road surface from its inception up to the date of my accident on December 3rd 2011.

Through my counsel I would like to know what information the City of Hamilton collected from the various police investigations of car accidents from the early days of the Red Hill Valley Parkway, since I believe there must have been multiple testing of the coefficient of friction of the road surface in some, if not many, of the accidents in that time period.

I would also like to know why City staff saw fit to conceal the 2013 report of Tradewind Scientific Ltd as well as why the 2007 MTO report never saw the light of day until 2019?
